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Local mechanisms for Roma inclusion

- Lack of or poor/nonfunctional local political and institutional framework is often the great obstacle in Roma inclusion.
- Local policies must be established in such a way that they relate to the real situation, and be in accordance with the goals of national strategic documents and EU policies.
- It is necessary for state institutions to cooperate with Roma civil society organizations.
- All relevant issues should be made publicly available to enable critical examination.



The most common problem at the local level is the lack of a sufficient political and institutional framework for Roma inclusion. This disadvantage is often a mixture of different specific challenges:

- Lack of an institutional framework at the national level provided for by law (such as the lack of a relevant local body, or a coordinator for Roma issues at the local level);
- Inefficiency of the institutional framework, even in cases where it exists;
- Lack of the necessary policy and program framework at the local level, even in cases where there is an institutional framework;
- Lack of professionals in existing institutions that deal with vulnerable groups, which results in low capacity for dealing with this issue;
- Lack of coordination, ie. culture of cooperation, lack of mechanisms and tools for cooperation.

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In order for the established institutional mechanisms for Roma inclusion to function, it is necessary to:

- ensure meaningful and substantial participation of representatives of Roma community within the mechanism
- provide a budget for their work and ensure a sufficient (sufficient, therefore not too large) number of motivated members
- that these mechanisms have clear tasks, operational plans and a clear and feasible scheme for monitoring and evaluating their own work.
- ensure transparency of work of the mechanisms
- maintain and improve cross-sectoral cooperation within the mechanism, but also between the mechanism and relevant institutions and organizations

Steps in establishing local mechanismscouncils, committees



- Mapping of institutions, organizations and individuals for membership in the Council. The membership must include representatives of Roma community and/or Roma civil society organizations
- Drafting and adoption of the act on the formation of the Council the responsibility of local selfgovernment, following regular procedures
- Drafting of the Council's Rules of Procedure
- Holding the constitutive session of the Council
- Drafting and adoption of the Council's Annual Work Program.
- Regular work of the Council and transparent reporting

Beside political bodies, depending on national regulations, local self-governments can establish action bodies/operational mechanisms such are:



- Systematized position and employmentof community mediator such are Roma coordinators, in the local self-government administration
- Action teams consisting of representatives of various institutions: health, education, employment, social protection... with main mandate to be present in the Roma community i.e. conduct outreach activities
- Local office for Roma inclusion as unit within local self-government
- And similar

What else a local government and institutions can do institutions can do order to ensure participation of Roma community:

- Capacity building of Roma grassroots and local CSOs
- The participation of independent experts in local policy developments
- Creating and adopting Protocols of Participation
- Involve Roma in governing boards in relevant institutions such are local social protection centers/centers for social work
- Involve Roma parents in councils of parents in local schools
- Involve Roma youth in the work of local youth mechanisms
- Involve Roma women in local mechanism and processess relating gender quality and Roma position in general
